Approval of funding to send staff to the 2018 national conference of the American Planning Association

SUMMARY:

Each year, the American Planning Association (APA) holds a national conference, highlighting emerging issues, new trends, and best practices in the planning field. The conference program is diverse, and includes such topics as natural resources and environmental planning, innovation in government, parks and recreation, land-use and development, and many others pertinent to the District's mission.

The adoption of the Balanced Urban Ecology policy in 2014 asserted the District's focus on the integration of land-use and water planning. Through its adoption, the Board of Managers recognized not only that the District's water quality goals could be better achieved through partnership development, but also that the impact of our work on the communities we serve could be amplified by seeking to add value to related public initiatives such as parks and open space and economic development, working towards the integration of natural resources with social and economic value.

In February of 2017, the Board of Managers adopted an organizational strategic direction which sought to align District resources to reflect, amongst other things, the role of the Balanced Urban Ecology policy as foundational to the District's success. This included updating the District's vision, mission, and guiding principles, as well as defined the organization's principal strategies of:

- Developing high impact capital projects integrated with non-water initiatives through multijurisdictional partnership
- Changing the land-use water policy environment to increase early value added partnership with private development, public infrastructure, and public policy and planning

Staff are currently engaged in the development of a land use - water policy plan to establish an approach to achieving the latter organizational strategy. One of the recommendations within that plan will be to increase the local, regional, and national profile of the District within the land use and municipal planning community, allowing the District to increase regional influence and more effectively integrate our work with that of our partners.

Increased participation in the APA – locally, regionally, and nationally – provides a professional development opportunity to increase staff's ability to effectively implement both of the District principal strategies. Staff not only can develop increased awareness of best practices to enhance our implementation effectiveness, but also develop a profile within the planning community that can be leveraged for organizational growth and planning and policy influence.

Staff intend to use attendance at the conference to make new professional connections and showcase some of the major planning and project initiatives, with the goal of presenting these initiatives at the 2019 conference. Initiatives to feature include:

- The 2017 Watershed Management Plan
- The Greenway planning and implementation
- Planning in the Six Mile Creek-Halsted Bay Subwatershed, with focus on integration of water resources with land use planning through "green-printing"

With the requested funding not to exceed. \$7,500, three (3) staff members will be able to attend the conference in April. This amount will cover conference registration, travel, and accommodations based on the following costs, resulting in a total cost between \$2,100 and \$2,500 per attendee:
