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Board, Committee, and Task Force Reports

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President's Report:

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President White reported on the following items:

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The next meeting of the Metropolitan Chapter of the Minnesota Association of Watershed Districts will be on July 19; Managers Olson and Blixt indicated that they plan to attend;

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• The latest issue of Minnesota Cities features a story on resiliency and climate change, reflecting that the District and cities share a common concern on this issue;

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The Lakeshore Weekly News has invited the District to contribute to its annual lifestyle guide, which is an opportunity to highlight recent partnership initiatives in the watershed.

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Planning and Policy Committee Report:

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Manager Miller referred to the minutes of the Committee meeting in the meeting materials.

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Citizen Advisory Committee Report

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Manager Olson reported that Ms. Becky Christopher attended the meeting and provided a review of issues in the update to the District Comprehensive Plan. There was a lengthy discussion of priorities and helpful input from the CAC. The CAC also reviewed and recommended approval of five cost share grant applications.

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2015 Research and Monitoring Report

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Ms. Kailey Cermak appeared before the Board and presented the results of the 2015 monitoring report. The managers thanked Ms. Cermak for her report.

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Public Hearings

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- 85 Ms. Yvette Christianson and Ms. Diane Spector appeared before the Board of Managers and provided an update on the Ecosystem evaluation project. Manager Blixt asked why 86 the water quantity indicator was not a part of the recreational values. Ms. Spector noted
- 88 that it had been primarily considered an indicator for habitat. Manager Becker asked
- 89 whether chemical data had been obtained on insecticides, for example. Ms. Spector stated

that this data is typically not available but that staff could check with the United States Geological Survey.

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The managers thanked Ms. Spector and Ms. Christianson for their presentation.

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Action Items

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Resolution 16-060 Authorization to Execute a Purchase Agreement for Lake Town 9th Wetland Restoration Easement

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Ms. Anna Brown appeared before the Board of Managers to review the request for board action. Manager Olson noted that he attended a Victoria City Council meeting recently where the Mayor, Councilmembers, and the City Engineer expressed appreciation for the benefits of this project compared to the ordinary wetland banking option. Manager Olson expressed his gratitude to staff for success with this project. *Following discussion, it was moved by Manager Olson, seconded by Manager Miller, to adopt resolution 16-060:*

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Minnehaha Creek Watershed District Board of Managers authorize the administrator to execute, on advice and consent of counsel, the agreement for the purchase, at a cost not to exceed \$80,000, of the easement on the Hesse property, with nonsubstantive revisions to effect the purposes of the transaction as necessary, and take such other further actions necessary to effect the transaction, including but not limited to the payment of not to exceed \$5,000 in closing and related costs.

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Upon vote, the motion carried, 7-0.

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BOARD DISCUSSION ITEMS

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Review Preliminary Design for the Highway 101 Causeway Shoreline Reconstruction Project

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Ms. Tiffany Schaufler appeared before the Board of Managers to provide an update on the plans for this project. The managers thanked Ms. Schaufler for her presentation.

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State Buffer Program and Draft Policies

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- 128 Ms. Becky Christopher appeared before the Board of Managers to provide an overview of
- draft policies developed by the Minnesota Board of Water and Soil Resources to
- implement the new buffer law. She recommended that the Board of Managers consider
- whether it wishes to exercise enforcement jurisdiction for the buffer law, and then
- develop comments on the draft policies in light of that consideration. Ms. Christopher
- noted that in general, the Board of Managers has directed that the District move away

134 from a regulatory focus, and accordingly the managers may wish to decline to exercise 135 jurisdiction in this area.

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- 137 Manager Shekleton stated that he appreciated the shift away from a regulatory focus, but 138 also wondered whether buffer enforcement maybe an appropriate additional tool in the
- 139 District's toolkit. Manager Olson noted that the District is already involved in buffers in a
- 140 variety of settings on a voluntary basis and that it may not be necessary to expand beyond
- 141 that role. President White noted that given the definition of buffers as any perennial
- 142 vegetation in the State law, there is not necessarily much benefit to be gained through
- local enforcement. Manager Rogness stated that he appreciated Manager Shekleton's 143
- 144 suggestion and noted that there seems to be a wide variety of practices with buffers
- 145 around water bodies.

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- 147 Mr. Smith provided some additional legislative background. Mr. James Wisker appeared
- 148 before the Board of Managers and stated that he felt that in terms of mission and focus on
- 149 District priorities, there would seem to be little value to involvement in buffer law
- 150 enforcement. He asked what additional information the managers needed in order to
- 151 determine the proper course of action. Mr. Erdahl noted that many of these issues are
- 152 addressed also through local shoreland ordinances. Following discussion, it was moved
- 153 by Manager Shekleton, seconded by Manager Rogness, to direct the staff and legal
- counsel to develop proposed comments on the draft polices for consideration by the 154
- 155 Board at its Joint Committee meeting on July 21. Upon vote, the motion carried, 7-0.
- West 54th Street/Arden Park Stream Restoration Project Briefing 157

Ms. Renae Clark appeared before the Board of Managers and reviewed the concept plan 159 160 for the Arden Park Stream Restoration Project. She noted that this item would be on the 161

agenda of the July 28 meeting for action. The managers thanked Ms. Clark for her

162 presentation.

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Park Nicollet Methodist Hospital Partnership Briefing

Mr. Wisker provided an overview of the current plans for the cooperative project with 166

Methodist Hospital involving a three acre wetland restoration and long-term easement

and management responsibilities for vegetation by the District. The managers thanked

169 Mr. Wisker for his presentation.

Administrators Report:

175 The MCWD Workshop on the Water is scheduled for Wednesday, August 3; 176

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- 177 Eric Fieldseth was invited to serve on the Minnesota Aquatic Invasive Species 178 Research Center (MAISRC) technical committee, which consists of 8 members 179 from MAISRC & DNR and 2 members from other organizations. This will be a 180 great way for MCWD to participate, influence and stay in the loop with the latest 181 from MAISRC and other AIS partners; 182 183 A letter was sent to residents in the Robinson Bay area to inform them of the 184 study of zebra mussel veliger control that will start soon in their bay; 185 The Minnehaha Creek Clean will be on Sunday, July 24. 186
