49 Mr. Smith referred to the memo of October 24 outlining several governance issues for the

- 50 Board's consideration. The managers turned to discussing the matter of decorum. Mr. Smith
- 51 noted that Manager Blixt also provided additional sample decorum policies from the City of
- 52 Eden Prairie, Minnesota Senate, and Minnesota Mayors Association.
- 53
- 54 Manager Shekleton stated that he felt that apart from personnel issues, the Board of Managers 55 had been guided by policy consensus on water resource issues and has exhibited good decorum.
- 55 56

57 It was moved by Manager Shekleton, seconded by Manager Miller, to direct legal counsel to 58 prepare a draft code of conduct and decorum consistent with this discussion and the Board's

59 *historic practices.* The managers also emphasize the importance of treating not only board

- 60 members but also members of the public with courtesy and respect.

- 62 Manager Olson arrived at this point in the meeting (6:25 p.m.).

64 President White noted that the Board of Managers has an existing code of conduct at Governance65 Policy #4.

67 The managers discussed past practice in receiving comments from interested members of the

68 public on various agenda items, and noted that this has been typically subject to the discretion of

69 the Chair; rulings of the Chair may be overruled by the Board. *There being no further*

70 discussion, upon vote, the motion to direct legal counsel to draft a policy of decorum for

- 71 insertion in the code of conduct carried, 7-0.

73 <u>REPORTING RESPONSIBILITY OF PUBLIC OFFICIALS, CONTINUED</u> 74

It was moved by Manager Shekleton, seconded by Manager Miller, to remove the Resolution
of October 23 from the table. Upon vote, the motion carried, 7-0.

President White asked Managers Olson and Blixt if they had further evidence or information for

79 the Board's consideration. *It was moved by Manager Olson, seconded by Manager Blixt to*

80 strike the entire draft Resolution and insert a new Resolution which was distributed, along

- 81 with additional attachments.

Mr. Smith noted that the duty arising under Minnesota Statute 609.456 is a duty that lies withindividual public officials.

- 103 The managers discussed general governance concerns. President White noted the resignation of a 104 member of the Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC), citing a "climate of bickering" among 105 CAC members. President White stated that it may be worth considering suspending CAC 106 meetings in order to reevaluate how it can best serve the purposes of the Watershed District. 107 Manager Blixt stated that any such topic should be noticed and subject to extensive public 108 discussion. Manager Olson asked legal counsel if there is a legal basis to suspend CAC meetings. 109 Mr. Smith responded that the District is required by statute to have a Citizens Advisory 110 Committee, but that CAC members serve at the pleasure of the Board of Managers. 111
