Summary:

At the December 16, 2021 Board Meeting, the Minnehaha Creek Watershed District (MCWD) Board of Managers authorized the initiation of a stakeholder engagement process for the Land & Water Partnership Initiative, which is focused on strengthening collaboration with cities and other key partners to support the implementation of impactful projects that benefit the watershed and communities. The stakeholder engagement plan included establishment of a Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) made up of staff representatives across the cities, counties, and park agencies in the watershed. The role of the TAC will be to advise the MCWD on program and policy changes designed to promote partnership, including:

- <u>Land & Water Partnership Program</u>: Development of a new program to provide funding and technical support for partner projects that provide significant water resource benefit
- <u>Permitting Program Alignment</u>: Streamlining the MCWD's regulatory process and rules to improve customer service, align with state requirements, reduce duplication of efforts, and promote early coordination for projects

On July 7, 2022, a kickoff mailing was sent to staff and policymakers at the cities, counties, and other partner agencies to introduce the initiative and invite them to complete an interest form indicating how they would like to engage. MCWD staff also had many calls and meetings with partners to discuss the initiative. Based on these conversations, and the interest form submittals, 17 TAC members and 9 alternates were recommended by staff and appointed by the Board at the August 11, 2022 Board Meeting.

In a recent coordination meeting, staff at the City of Orono expressed interest in also joining the TAC. Staff is recommending the addition of the following TAC member and alternate to represent the City of Orono:

- Melanie Curtis, Planner primary representative
- Laura Oakden, Community Development Director alternate

This would bring the total membership to 18, with 10 alternates, as shown in the attached list. The first TAC meeting is scheduled for October 5, 2022.
