Authorization for District Administrator to terminate contract with Barr Engineering to develop interpretive signage for the Reach 20 education area.

Barr Engineering was contracted to develop interpretive signs as part of the stream restoration and trail initiative project in St Louis Park. The Board of Managers passed a motion to forward a resolution authorizing the District Administrator to execute a contract with DogTooth Design for professional services to develop interpretive signage for the Reach 20 Education Area to the next Board Meeting for final action.

SUMMARY:

As part of the Reach 20 Community Trails Initiative, District staff are working to develop interpretive signage for the education area that is being constructed along Minnehaha Creek. This gathering area will showcase eight large panel signs for public education using interpretive principles.

Development of these signs requires professional design and interpretation services from a qualified consultant. Staff had been working with Barr Engineering to develop drafts of eight interpretive signs. Upon receiving and reviewing the first drafts of the eight interpretive signs and meeting with Barr Engineering, staff determined additional interpretive expertise was needed and is recommending the District end the contract for professional services.

Scope of Work

The scope of professional consulting services included:

- Obtain detailed rough text for each of the signs from District staff, and provide edits to further refine the
- Obtain photographs to be used on the signs from District staff or elsewhere.
- Create preliminary drafts of each of the signs and meet with District staff to discuss revisions. This is considered iteration one.

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- Revise the preliminary drafts of each sign as per staff comments and produce second draft signs. This is considered iteration two.

 Present second draft signs to District staff for review and comment.
- Revise the second draft signs as per staff comments and produce the final signs.
- Send electronic files of the final signs to District staff.
- Coordinate with a sign manufacturer determined by District staff for production of the signs.

WHEREAS,	at the November 14, 2013 Board of Managers meeting, the Managers approved final design revisions to construct a trail system and education area along Reach 20 of Minnehaha Creek; and		
WHEREAS,	education and outreach are imperative to the success of the District's efforts throughout the urban corridor, including the Reach 20 stream restoration and trail initiative; and
